



## The BMW RA Rally June 20<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup>

In 2007 my wife, Ursula, and I decided to retire from twenty-five years in the Seattle area. I have one of the best wives in the world. She flat out told me I WOULD retire while I was still able to ride. We started to decide on places to retire to (the Seattle area has great scenic routes and I can tolerate the rain, but not the tax structure) so we started to look around. Our children and grandchildren were just north of Atlanta, but there was no way in He\*\* I was going to return to Atlanta and the congestion and traffic in that area. So, we decided on the mountain area of North Carolina in the Asheville area.

I mentioned 2007 because that was the year we had decided to fly east and look at the Asheville area. Shortly after Christmas 2006 I was reading some of my magazines and I saw the BMW RA was having their national rally that year in Asheville at the Biltmore Mansion. I yelled to Ursula, "Guess when we are going to Asheville and guess how we are traveling!" She was able to guess! We were impressed with the area, the tax structure, the cost of housing, and the roads! In 2009 I sent her ahead and told her to buy us a home and in July I followed her. Other than totaling the R1200 RT in Kansas while heading to NC, I have had no regrets. However, that's another story.

There is no state, but Hawaii, that I haven't ridden in and I have never found riding that I have enjoyed as much as the North Carolina mountains. Even the Tail of the Dragon is overrated! I could show you a hundred routes with more curves, switchbacks, elevation changes and just plain fun, with less highway patrol and no 35 MPH speed limits!

If you come to the BMW RA rally at the Biltmore I'll show them to you! Since moving to the south-east I have joined four BMW clubs and am an officer in the Asheville Chapter. I will be laying out the rally's on-road rides. So, come on down and I'll show you!

Pre-registration for the rally is \$65.00 per person for RA members and \$75.00 for non-members. That's really inexpensive as it allows full access to the Biltmore Mansion (camping will be on the grounds) which is usually a \$50.00 a day charge by itself, and the rally fee is for the full three days. The Biltmore is the largest single family dwelling in the United States with 250 rooms, 33 family and guest bedrooms, 43 bathrooms, 65 fireplaces, 3 kitchens and an indoor swimming pool. The RA is the only organization that the Biltmore has ever allowed to camp on the grounds. They are also allowing us build a GS track fairly close to the camping area.

The rally is June 20<sup>th</sup> to the 23<sup>rd</sup>. By the way, the trip and the rally can easily be done in a two week vacation period from anywhere in the continental United States. Ursula and I did it in 2007 from Seattle with a two day side trip to visit our children north of Atlanta after the rally and on our way home. Hope to see all of you in Asheville this coming summer.

## "WILD, WONDERFUL WEST VIRGINIA"

Here is my scouting report for the summer 2003 BMW International rally being held in Charleston, WVA. First off, I would like to say that WVA has some of the most picturesque scenery that this country has to offer. There are plenty of windy, twisty back roads than just about any other state. There were 9 of us who attended this scouting trip and we stayed in the Holiday Inn downtown on Saturday 8 Feb. 2003. The trip down for my wife and me was via Somerset, Pa to 281, which turn into 26 at the WVA line, and then we got on I-68 at Bruceton Mills. From Bruceton Mills we headed west to I-79 south. This route takes 2 hours and 15-20 min. total. Charleston, WVA reminds me of Wheeling, WVA or Stubenville, Ohio. An old city striving to make it in an ever-changing world. We all went to eat at the "5th Quarter restaurant located just up the street from the Convention Center. Food was good and so was the beer. Finding places to eat in Charleston is a challenge on a cold Feb. Saturday afternoon. Our plans were fluid and open for the afternoon. We headed across the Kanawha River and went upstream to visit the Charleston University so we could see the camping site/ area. This is a good 1-2 miles away from the Convention Center where most of the events will be taking place.

Another item of interest is that you will not be able to ride your bike directly up to your tent/ camping site. You will need to leave your bikes out of sight in a school parking lot. Apparently there will be dorm rooms available as well- more to follow in the MOA. What we felt was even more challenging was locating a local convenience store that had beer and liquor after our cold, quick tour. CAUTION- every street in the downtown area is one way. Once we scored liquid refreshments at Eckert Drug Store we headed to the rooms for some warm leisure time. Later in the evening we all headed out to observe the "night life" on the Main drag downtown (Capital St.). Gary Smith put it best when he stated; "We came to see what there was and got to see more than we needed to". We "bar-hopped" around and finally got the urge to eat again. A local establishment provided us guidance to travel 3 blocks down the street then enter a "basement restaurant". This place only had appetizers at 2100 and there was no alternative left. So, we ordered beers and appetizers. We ate and departed quickly. On our way out we got to meet a newly married couple leaving their wedding reception carrying their baby and wearing leather coats. Yes, we came, scouted and saw all the entertainment we needed to for one night. We event got to witness a reject band from NYC at the Sam's Uptown Café. (Somewhere off I-79 one hour out). 7) Plan well in advance to eat... somewhere. The mall directly across form the convention center does have a few restaurants in it. 8) Sleep with one eye open...


